PETITIONER'S NOTICE OF MOTION, and, MOTION FOR SUMMARY JUDGMENT

I, Steven Alan Magritz, Petitioner in the above captioned matter, give Notice of motion, and herewith move the Court for summary judgment on the claims of judicial bias and denial of assistance of counsel pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 56 and Civil L. R. 56 in favor of Petitioner and against Respondent as set forth in my "Request For Relief", Dkt. 1:28, and iterated herein. There is no genuine issue of material fact; and, thus, summary judgment is proper as a matter of law.

Rule 56. Summary Judgment

- (a) Motion for Summary Judgment or Partial Summary Judgment. A party may move for summary judgment, identifying each claim or defense--or the part of each claim or defense--on which summary judgment is sought. The court shall grant summary judgment if the movant shows that there is no genuine dispute as to any material fact and the movant is entitled to judgment as a matter of law. The court should state on the record the reasons for granting or denying the motion.
- (b) "... a party may file a motion for summary judgment at any time until 30 days after the close of all discovery. (emphasis added).

This motion is based on my petition and the documents incorporated therein filed March 22, 2018, Dkt. 1, Dkt. 1-1, Dkt. 1-2, Dkt. 1-3, Dkt. 1-4; and, my "Brief In

Opposition To Respondent's Motion To Dismiss", Dkt. 8; and, my "Affidavit of Bias" and exhibits in support of brief in opposition, Dkt. 9 through Dkt. 9-7; and, my "Mandatory Judicial Notice - FRE 201(c)(2) With Exhibits A through J (22 pages)", Dkt. 10 through Dkt. 10-10, filed July 12, 2018, all incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein. This motion is supported by a memorandum of law, Civil L. R. 56(b)(1)(A) and a statement of material facts, Rule 56(c)(1) in the form of an affidavit / declaration, Rule 56(c)(4) and Civil L. R. 56(b)(1)(C) and (D) executed pursuant to Title 28 United States Code § 1746(1). Both the memorandum and the statement of facts are incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.

- 4. Ozaukee County Circuit Court had no subject matter jurisdiction in case no. 2011CF236;
- 5. Sandy A. Williams infringed upon or violated my constitutionally secured rights;
- 6. Adam Yale Gerol infringed upon or violated my constitutionally secured rights;

- 7. Ozaukee County case no. 2011CF236 is VOID ab initio;
